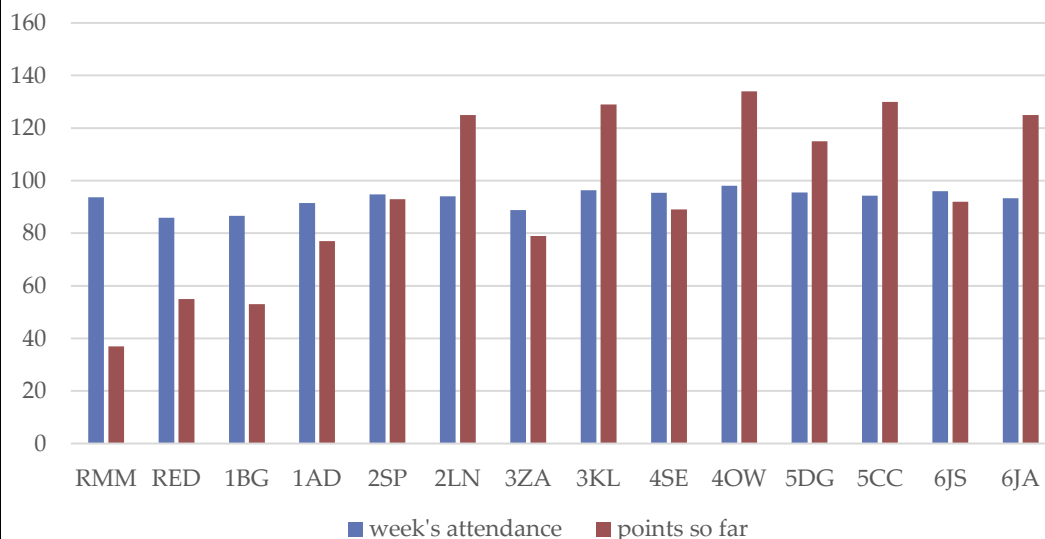

With one week left, the competition is very close! Currently 4OW are leading by 4 points, closely followed by 5CC

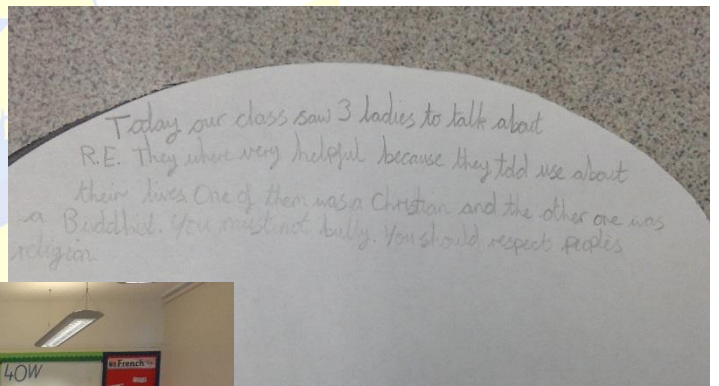


Zoo4U visit to Year 3

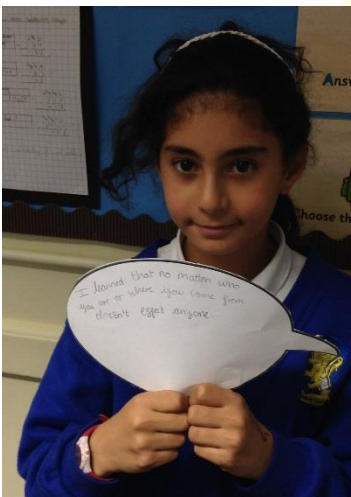
