EYFS	<p>In the EYFS, History is taught cross curricular as part of Understanding the World. Children have daily opportunities to learn about life and our world in the past, present day and also to share our thoughts of how our future life will evolve. Children may share their knowledge of the past through family stories about how our world has changed since our grandparents' time and they will understand that life is constantly changing and developing. Children develop an understanding of time using key words such as now, then, yesterday, later, tomorrow. Teachers and support staff can also share their experiences of how life was when they were young, i.e., toys, technology, transport, clothes and so on. Children can research the older generation and their daily life in comparison to life today. Children are encouraged to share their own memories of the past.</p>
