Some facts...

- There are 7.1 billion people in the world and 7.4 billion active mobile phones.
- **Facebook** 1.3 billion profiles worldwide 300m photos uploaded every day
- Youtube 4 billion videos watched every day 60 hours of video uploaded every minute
- WhatsApp 34 billion messages sent every day

Some facts...

- In 2013 29% of children aged 8-11 were 'friends' with someone online that they had never met
- 40% of 13-18year olds admitted SEXTING
- 60% of 13-18 year olds admitted to seeing inappropriate images of others
- Children as young as 8 years old are blackmailed or exploited for photographs they have posted online




































What happens when a ClickCEOP report is sent?

CEOP is a law enforcement agency — reporting is like reporting to police

Child empowered to make a 'police statement' — but never pressured to

Often voluntary
agencies get involved
afterwards to work
with children moving
forward

What can you do?

- Have the conversation early and often
- Ask your child what they do online (including phones)
- Let your child teach you how to use social networks and games
- Know who your child is talking to online
- Set rules and agree boundaries
- Make sure content is age appropriate
- Use parental controls
- Make sure your child's privacy is protected
- Check your child knows how to use reporting tools
- Ensure internet access is in an exposed place within the home – there should be nothing to hide
